

Monday, October 26, 2020 from 5:30-7:30 p.m


Workshops and [College Representatives](#) from CA and across the country will host virtual presentations and meeting rooms for participants.

How do I access the event?

What browser should I use?

Google Chrome is the preferred browser for this event. Safari and Internet Explorer have limited capabilities with the event platform.

Who should attend?

ALL San Luis Obispo County high school students.
Parents and/or guardians are welcome to attend as well.

Why should I attend?

It is a great opportunity to connect with college and university representatives from throughout California and the nation in a single evening. In addition, workshops will provide valuable information about selecting and paying for the right college for you.

What should I do before I go?

Most students attend College Night unprepared, and that's a mistake. You should know what you are looking for before you participate and who and what you want to talk about. Which reps do you want to meet? What do you know about their college already and what do you want to know? If you have a conversation with a rep and she can clearly see you are interested and familiar with the school, that impression can have an impact. A few thoughtful, well-researched questions are best.

What should I talk about?

A good way to start is by introducing yourself, your field of interest and where you currently attend high school. Then follow up with "I'm considering attending _____ (name of school), what sets your college apart from others?" [Click here](#) to view sample questions.

What if I have never heard of the college/university before?

It's okay to connect with a school you are unfamiliar with. This is your opportunity to learn about new schools, understanding that one of these freshly discovered colleges might be the perfect place for you.

Ask for contact information from the College Representative, and use it. Make sure you get the admission rep's contact information. Within a day or two, send them a thank-you note and let them know you're interested in their school. Keep it short, polite and professional.
